"Residential Burglary Solved, One Arrested, Three Suspects Remain at Large"

On March 16, 2014, at approximately 2:33 pm, Coalinga Police Officers responded to the 400 block of East Pleasant Street to investigate a residential burglary.

The victim, who will remain confidential, had just returned to her Coalinga home after being away for a few days, to find almost the entire content of the home gone. The stolen property included couches, clothing, electronics and other personal items.

The home was processed and investigators began interviewing witnesses and neighbors.

Witnesses in the area were able to provide police with information that the home had been burglarized several times, over the course of a few days. The suspects were identified by witnesses as 25 year old Jesus Quintero, 23 year old Alexis Montes, 20 year old Ashley Campos, and her sister 22 year old Cindy Campos. All are from Coalinga.

Witnesses reported seeing the suspect taking the stolen property into a home in the 500 block of East Pleasant Street where Ashley and Cindy Campos reside. A search warrant was executed at the home, and in excess of 120 pieces of stolen property belonging to the victim was recovered.

While at the scene of the search warrant, Cindy Campos was taken into custody without incident.

The remaining at large suspects including, Jesus Quintero, Alexis Montes and Ashley Campos who are wanted by the Coalinga Police Department for their part in the burglary.

The suspects in this case face felony charges of residential burglary, conspiracy, and possession of stolen property.
